Player Check-In

Families should plan to arrive between 12:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. for check-in. Please enter parking lot from Eagle Road. Enter through black gate and park on the right. Check-in is held in Eisenhower Hall.

Check-in will be staggered by age group for camp. Check-in will occur at 12:00 PM for the NBA Division (ages 14-17), 1:30 PM for the Big East Division (ages 12-13), and 3:00 PM for the ACC Division (ages 10-11).

Families with players in separate divisions can move in at the first check-in time. For example, if a family has a 14 year-old player and a 10 year-old player, the check-in time will be 12:00 PM.

Due to Health & Safety protocols, families will not be permitted inside the residence hall during the check-in process. Families will, however, be permitted inside Eisenhower Hall during check-in and check-out to complete all necessary paperwork, meet with camp staff, etc.

Upon checking-in and moving out, families will complete the Residence Hall Checklist with a member of the Jr. 76ers Camps staff to inspect the condition of the room.

Player Check-Out

Player Code of Conduct

Player rules help us provide a safe and secure environment for everyone. Staff should know and enforce the rules from day one. The Player Code of Conduct is signed by each player before they arrive and reads:

Your child is required to abide by each of the following rules and policies (“Rules & Policies”) whether the player is on or off-campus. Jr. 76ers Camps/ESF reserves the right to enforce all aspects of the Rules & Policies. In the event of even a single violation, Jr. 76ers Camps/ESF reserves the right to take disciplinary action which includes but is not limited to a warning, consultation with you, or in cases of serious or repeated incidences, exclusion, or dismissal from the Program.

Rules & Policies:

- Treat fellow players, staff (including instructors), campus neighbors, and affiliates with respect and courtesy.
- Behave in ways that do not expose oneself or others to injury or endangerment, and that do not diminish in any other way the experience of others.
- Respect the campus and other physical surroundings, including equipment, furnishings, and facilities. Players must report to a Program director any damage that they cause to this property, or to property located off-campus.
- Refrain from the use of profane, obscene, derogatory, abusive, or threatening language.
- Refrain from the use, purchase, or possession of, or any other involvement with, alcohol, illegal drugs (including marijuana in any form, such as leaves, pills, oils, topical ointments, tinctures, liquids, or edibles), drug paraphernalia (including vaporizers), or tobacco products (including e-cigarettes). Jr. 76ers Camps/ESF will have sole and complete discretion in identifying and determining “use,” “purchase,” “possession,” and “involvement.”
- Refrain from the use, purchase, or possession of weapons (including firearms and knives), ammunition, explosives, fireworks, open flames, candles (including tea lights), torchiere halogen lamps, heating appliances (including space heaters, stoves, and hot plates), air conditioners (unless medically authorized), pornography, drones, hoverboards, electric scooters, refrigerators (in excess of 3.4 cubic feet or 1.5 amps), or any other item that exposes oneself or others to injury or unreasonable discomfort. Jr. 76ers Camps/ESF will have sole and complete discretion in identifying and determining “use,” “purchase,” “possession,” “injury” and “unreasonable discomfort.”
- Players may not bring animals onto campus (Jr. 76ers Camps/ESF may approve, in writing, certain requests for the possession of service or emotional support animals in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and Fair Housing Act).
- Abide by curfew and quiet-hours requirements.
- Residence halls are gender specific. Players are not allowed to visit any residence hall containing players of a different gender. Exceptions may be made by Program staff, and in those cases, Program staff supervision may be required.
- Players are required to be present from the first day to the last day of the Program. In rare cases, there may be valid reasons for a child to arrive late, depart early, or leave the Program for a period. Permission for such arrangements may only be considered by the Program director and only after the submission of a written request from the parent/guardian.
- Players may not leave campus except when accompanied by a member of the Jr. 76ers Camps/ESF staff, or when both of the following conditions are present: (i) the child is accompanied by you, or a person whom you authorize



who is at least 18 years of age, and (ii) the individual with whom your child leaves campus is prepared to present verifiable, official identification.

- Players must remain within the approved campus boundaries, and when walking from one location to another within those boundaries, may only do so if all of the following conditions are met: (i) the commute takes place during approved times, (ii) the player is part of a group of three or more players, (iii) at least one player in the group is available via mobile phone at all times, and (iv) all players in the group must sign out through the residential director's office.
- While attending a Program, players may not drive a motor vehicle.
- Campus security is paramount. Players must report any missing key or identification card to a Program director immediately after discovering that the item is missing.
- Players are fully responsible for their own personal belongings (including sports equipment) and will not hold Jr. 76ers Camps/ESF responsible for any related loss or damage due to the player's negligence.
- With respect to a player's use of technology, the internet, or host networks, whether before or during a Program, conduct that is inappropriate or harmful, whether to Jr. 76ers Camps/ESF, ESF's Host/Partner Institutions, other players, staff, or instructors, is prohibited. Such conduct includes, but is not limited to, jeopardizing another's safety or privacy; downloading, displaying, or sending illegal, obscene, or offensive files or messages; harassment, bullying, or other attacks; use of another person's password; unauthorized use or access of another person's work or files; and the use or access of a computer or network for commercial purposes.
- Unless an exception is made by Jr. 76ers Camps/ESF, use of cell phones, laptops, tablets, or other electronic devices (including but not limited to devices used for music, reading, or gaming) will not be permitted during class or planned activities.
- Entrance to and exit from campus may only be made through approved entrances and exits.
- During certain Programs, players may have free time, some of which will be unsupervised and independent. During these periods, players are still required to abide by the Terms & Conditions, respect all Program rules and behavioral guidelines, and exercise caution and good judgment to ensure their wellbeing.
- Jr. 76ers Camps/ESF/Host Institutions may establish additional rules and policies.
- As referenced above, your child must obey all local, state, and federal laws.
- You further acknowledge that you have read, and agree with, the following Rules & Policies, which apply directly to you, the parent/guardian:
 - The Program may contain activities or group living arrangements or interactions that are new to your child, or that come with risks or uncertainties that your child is not used to dealing with at home or in other camp or school settings. As parent/guardian, you assume these risks on behalf of your child.
 - You are highly confident that your child is enthusiastic about attending the Program, and further, capable of handling the emotional, social, intellectual, linguistic, and physical aspects of the Program including any risks involved.

Residential Life

Jr. 76ers Camps will utilize two residence halls for summer 2021.

Von Steuben Hall will serve as the host facility for our Girls Basketball Camp, from Saturday, July 3 to Friday, July 9.

Younghusband Hall will serve as the host facility for our Boys Basketball Camp, from Saturday, July 3 to Friday, July 30.

Each room contains bunk beds, dressers, and a desk. Top bunks will be equipped with a bed rail. Bed rails cannot be removed and must remain intact throughout camp. [View a typical room here.](#)

Players at Jr. 76ers Camps will be given the option to have a roommate or to have a single room this summer. If you have not indicated your player's rooming preference yet, please contact info@jr76erscamps.com.

The residence halls have shared bathrooms for each floor. Bathrooms contain single-stall showers and single-stall toilets. All bathrooms will be cleaned several times per day.

Meals

All food during mealtimes will be served by the professional food service staff. Meals are nut-free and prepared in a nut-free facility.

Meals will be prepared for players with dietary restrictions (gluten-free, Kosher, vegan/vegetarian, etc.). If your player requires special meal accommodations, please indicate so in your ACTIVE profile or contact info@jr76erscamps.com.

The canteen snack bar is in Bower Hall and will be available for several hours each day. The canteen features pre-packaged snacks and drinks. There is no additional cost for players to access the canteen in 2021.

Laundry Service

Laundry service is available at a weekly rate of \$50. Laundry service is only available to players who will be staying for two-weeks and is not available for single-week players.

Laundry service for players attending camp from July 3 through July 16 will be picked-up on Friday, July 9 and returned on Sunday, July 11. Laundry service for players attending camp from July 17 through July 30 will be picked-up on Friday, July 23 and returned on Sunday, July 25.

Players utilizing laundry service will be given a Jr. 76ers Laundry Bag to send their belongings to the cleaners. All items should be individually marked and Jr. 76ers Camps is not responsible for any lost items.
